"Visit" is defined as a face-to-face encounter between a patient of an FQHC or RHC and specified health care professionals. Current law allows an FQHC or RHC to apply for an adjustment to its per-visit rate based on a change in the scope of services it provides. This bill would include a marriage and family therapist within those health care professionals covered under that definition.

As such, they must be considered during budget deliberations so that all spending proposals are weighed against each other at the same time. **Summary:** Would authorize a short-term residential treatment center to be operated as a children's crisis residential center, as defined, and would require the State Department of Social Services to regulate those programs, as specified. The bill would require the State Department of Health Care Services, in consultation with the County Behavioral Health Directors Association of California and representatives of provider associations, to establish interim Medi-Cal rates for children's crisis residential services, as prescribed.

**Governor's Message:** I am returning Assembly Bill 741 without my signature. This bill establishes a licensing category for children's crisis residential centers which would be regulated by the Department of Social Services. The licensing category proposed by this bill limits the length of treatment stays and the size of the centers. These restrictions are not consistent with federal rules and put funding in jeopardy. I recognize there is an acute shortage of residential programs that provide crisis mental health treatment for children and teens. Therefore, I am directing the Departments of Social Services and Health Care Services to work with county behavioral health directors and children's advocates to

I support establishing a quality assurance fee to bring in additional federal funding to support emergency transportation services. However, the structure of the rate increase in this bill is unlike any other fee structure supported by health care related quality assurance fees. I am concerned this structure puts the state general fund at risk for paying the increased rate if the revenue falls short or if the fee is reduced or removed in the future. I urge the Legislature and ambulance providers to work with the Departments of Health Care Services and Finance to restructure this fee in a way that protects the general fund and allows for an increase in reimbursement for emergency transportation services.
